Nancy Grace Roman



(May 16, 1925 – December 25, 2018) was an American astronomer and one of the first female executives at NASA. She is known to many as the "Mother of Hubble" for her role in planning the Hubble

Space Telescope. Throughout her career, Roman was also an active public speaker and educator, and an advocate for women in the sciences

Bernice Sandler

(1928-2019)

Brooklyn-born Bernice initially became aware of gender bias when she saw that boys got to do the best jobs in school. No feminist, it was her husband who sparked her interest in sex discrimination. Working with the Women's Equity Action League, she uncovered evidence of discrimina-



tion in almost all aspects of higher education. She filed hundreds of complaints against colleges, and was hired by Congress to research gender bias in academia. The result became **Title IX**, **the federal law that prohibits gender discrimination in education**. No longer could schools provide top-of-the-line facilities for male athletes and second-rate gear for women. Quotas that limited women's access to programs in law and medicine were abolished.

Aileen Cole Stewart

(ca. 1893—ca. 1997)



Aileen Cole Stewart passed her board examinations to be a nurse the same year the US entered WWI. Dedication and courage helped her climb the ranks, eventually becoming one of the first African American women to serve in the Army Nursing Corps.




