Open Primaries is finally on the ballot for NOV 3; it has been officially certified as Amendment 3. If passed, it will allow Florida's 3.7 million independents to vote in every taxpayer funded election.

The LWVFL's position since 2017: **Recommend** statewide use of an Open Primary system that would allow for the broadest possible voter participation, including No Party Affiliation and Minor Party affiliated voters.
