Did you attend the 17th Annual Spring Literary Luncheon? If you did, you heard our member Holly Mandelkern speak about her first published book: *Beneath White Stars: Holocaust Profiles in Poetry.* Holly is a poet, Holocaust educator, and lecturer. To that impressive list of achievements, she can now add record producer!

The following is an excerpt from *J Life Magazine* by Jill Duff-Hoppes with quotes from Holly.

For the project, Holly turned her poems into ballads and folk songs by collaborating with many talented musicians and singers – some local, some from across the United States and other countries. Holly's book, Beneath White Stars: Holocaust Profiles in Poetry, is a collection of more than 40 of her historically accurate, narrative poems. Her poetry tells the moving stories of brave Holocaust victims, survivors, rescuers, and resistors.

"The past few years have been an exciting journey for me serving as the producer and lyricist, adapting 17 poems from my book into songs. I had the privilege of working with more than 20 amazing musicians who brought to life these songs of courage and resistance. One of the reasons I produced this album is that I am hoping teachers and educators will use these songs when teaching about the Holocaust. Through music, I'm hoping that even more people will hear about the lives of the individuals in my book." In addition to being an award-winning, published poet, Holly is a lecturer, educator, and lifelong lover of music. She earned a degree in European history from Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tennessee, and a master's degree in library science from Florida State University. Holly taught teachers and students about Jewish resistance during the Holocaust for more than 20 years. She was inspired to study and teach about the Holocaust because of the experiences of her father, Herman Lodinger, who fought in World War II and was a prisoner of war in a labor camp with other Allied soldiers. He passed away in 2017, the same year Holly's book was published
