

FEBRUARY 2023 SPEAKER: CARLOS GUILLERMO SMITH



Carlos Guillermo Smith served in the Florida House of Representatives for six consecutive years beginning in 2016, when he made history as Florida's first openly-LGBTQ Latino state lawmaker.

In the aftermath of the Pulse nightclub shooting in his community, Carlos became a national leader on gun safety and the lead sponsor of new legislation restricting assault weapons in his state. Carlos is a respected civil rights leader who has championed open government, housing affordability, and funding for the arts.

In 2021, he led the charge against Florida's dangerous 'Don't Say Gay' law and has become a key critic of Governor Ron DeSantis' administration. Carlos currently works for Equality Florida and lives in Union Park with his husband Jerick Mediavilla, an educator from Puerto Rico.

Carlos will be reflecting on his six years of public service and the path ahead for Florida.

Betzy Ingle and I (with son David) parked at 8 a.m., January 2, in front of a locked Kennedy Space Center gate. We wanted to be sure of a premium view for a 9:55 a.m. launch, especially as David had never seen one and was returning the next day to Tokyo. As often happens, lift-off was canceled.

We still had fun, the best part being the "Chat with An Astronaut" (\$50 add-on fee per person). Limited to thirty people, it included cheap (but good enough for a new year) sparkling wine that was labeled as American champagne—albeit in plastic glasses—with a slightly chewy breakfast burrito, fresh fruit and yogurt. The thrill: Up-close facetime with John Fabian, a retired mission specialist, almost 84. He was out-of-the-world charming, sharp, and frank with his answers which included one from a child at our table: "Were you scared?" He replied yes, at every takeoff, which included an early *Challenger*. He also told of some other hairraising moments of risky decision-making and of a time when all the astronauts refused to fly with one particular payload. From one of my questions, we learned that the NASA explorers get no extra pay for space travel-but that cosmonauts do.




Geri Throne is a journalist, freelance writer and author of *Secret Battles*, her first novel. A native of New Jersey, she studied journalism at Syracuse University. Most of her career was spent at the *Orlando Sentinel* newspaper as an investigative reporter, editor,

and editorial writer before turning to creative writing and fiction. Her writing accomplishments include a firstplace national award from the Education Writers Association for her editorial series on voucher schools and a first-place short story fiction award from the Florida First Coast Writers.

During her later years at the *Orlando Sentinel*, Throne became interested in writing a book set in World War II when her father gave her a box full of wartime letters and journals. Not until after he died did she open the journals describing dangerous near-misses and heartbreaking losses in gripping detail. Yet letters to his wife rarely mentioned those events. Wondering what scars her father brought home from the war, she subsequently wrote a nonfiction account of his war time experiences for the *Sentinel's Florida Magazine*. Throne's book, *Secret Battles*, stays as close as possible to her father's Ninth Infantry Division's role in the war while using her imagination to create the novel and its unforgettable non-historic characters. Through her parents' letters, Throne shares the intimate struggle in *Secret Battles* of two people writing to keep hope and love alive during dark years in their lives.

Throne lives in Winter Park with her husband Ron and Coco, the wonder dog. She loves traveling, camping, boating and the sea.
