

#### **ZELLE**

A METHOD TO SEND MONEY TO A RECIPIENT THROUGH YOUR BANK, YOU ONLY NEED TO KNOW YOUR RECIPIENT'S ZELLE ACCOUNT ID. THERE ARE NO CHECKS, NO DELAY IN PAYMENT, NO MAILING.

MONEY IS RECEIVED WITHIN HOURS OF PAYING.

MOST BANKS OFFER ZELLE AS A METHOD OF PAY-MENT.

GO TO YOUR "PAY BILLS" SECTION AND SET UP AAUW AS YOUR RECIPIENT. USE aauwreserve@gmail.com.

**ZELLE IS PERFECTLY SAFE. NO BANK ACCOUNT** NUMBERS ARE INVOLVED. WHEN YOU SEND YOUR PAYMENT TO "AAUWRESERVE@GMAIL.COM," THE BANK WILL **RECOGNIZE THIS EMAIL AS "AAUW" AND THEN DEPOSITS IT IN OUR ACCOUNT.**
