Ingenue to Icon: The Fashion of Marjorie Merriweather Post—Millionairess and Collector

A little more than 100 years ago at the age of 27, Marjorie Merriweather Post took ownership of the \$20 million Post cereal company making her the wealth-

iest woman in the world! Colorful socialite (4 husbands), astute businesswoman, and ardent philanthropist, Post also had a passion for collections of Sevres porcelain, French Louis XIV furnishings, and decorative arts from Imperial Russia.


Her exquisite sense of fashion is revealed by more than 200 dresses and 300 fashion accessories, including custom-made hats, purses, shoes and jewelry curated in the Hillwood Estate, Museum & Gardens that was her Washington, DC, residence. Professor Kurtz was the associate curator of costumes and textiles at the Hillwood Museum. Professor Kurtz will discuss Post's iconic wardrobe that

spans seven decades from 1903-

1973.

Blueberries are in season, so a Blueberry Mazerka would be a great dessert for someone to bring!


Our diners vary from 4 to 20, so please bring enough to share. Leftovers are a side benefit of our gatherings, besides great conversation!
